Training Objectives and Responsibilities

- Management of emergency patients and intensive care unit patients under the supervision of specialists in Emergency and Critical Care Medicine (1 Diplomate ECVECC, 1 Diplomate ACVECC/ECVECC).
- Management of anesthesia under the supervision of specialists in Anesthesia and Analgesia (7 Diplomates ECVAA, 1 Diplomate ACVAA).
- Regular active participation in continuing education within the Emergency and Critical Care Medicine as well as Anesthesia departments (Book Club/Journal Club/Seminars).
- Night, weekend, and holiday shifts (Intensive Care Unit and Anesthesia under supervision).

Requirements

- A completed degree in Veterinary Medicine with a Swiss diploma or a diploma recognized by the Federal Office of Public Health (BAG), ideally as a recent graduate.
- Enthusiasm for working in a large, international team.
- A specific interest in Emergency/Critical Care Medicine and Anesthesia and an appreciation for challenging situations.
- Strong communication skills.
- A desire to learn how to work independently and responsibly in the fields of Emergency/Critical Care Medicine and Anesthesia, with a keen interest in learning new things.
- Excellent command of the English language (both written and spoken), with additional proficiency in German and/or French being an advantage.
